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Nebraska's Amber Waves of Grain in New York City

Ten days and counting to the “Urban Wheat Field” in New York City and Nebraska Wheat representatives Nebraska Wheat Board member Brent Robertson and wife Amy of Elsie, Executive Director Royce Schaneman, and Public Information Officer Zoe Olson are making final preparations for the trip. The Wheat Foods Council and sponsors from all areas of the wheat industry will unveil the Urban Wheat Field in the heart of the Big Apple, October 6 to 8. The event, open to the public from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. EST daily, will be located at the intersection of Water Street and South Street in New York City. The exhibit will showcase the different stages of a growing wheat crop, from early season green plants to the amber waves of grain at harvest time.

The Urban Wheat Field brings the farm-to-fork journey of the America's most consumed grain to life to educate people about all things wheat including agriculture, milling, baking and nutrition. The farm-to-fork journey is brought to life with various exhibit components including a quarter-acre wheat field and full-size combine representative of agriculture; a functioning mill and tabletop, hand-operated flour grinders representative of milling; a cooking demonstration counter and bread-baking oven representative of baking; and a wheat nutrition lab representative of nutrition.

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
